Tournament Schedule:

7:45 a.m. Skin checks

8:00 a.m. Weigh-ins (**Photo I.D. Required**)

9:00 a.m. Coaches meeting immediately following weigh-ins

10:00 a.m. Wrestling begins on 4 mats

Seeding/Bracket

All brackets will be 8 man brackets, four (4) wrestlers coming from Olympic / KINGCO and four (4) wrestlers from SPSL Sound Division sub-regional tournaments.

Weigh-ins:

Saturday, Feb 9, 8:00 a.m – North Mason High School Weight Room

All athletes will need **Photo I.D and weigh-in cards**. Weigh-in cards are needed to weigh-in. All teams should report at weigh-in time. We will weigh in by Teams.

*All alternates must weigh-in to be eligible for potential participation.

***Note: Once weigh-ins begin..... no cutting weight once in the facility.**

Any skin irregularities/diseases must be accompanied by a note form a physician stating the disease is non communicable. Physicians must have clearance filled out on **STATE APPROVED FORM**.

State Qualifiers:

The first four place finishers in each weight division will qualify for the State Wrestling Tournament to be held in the Tacoma Dome, February 15-16, 2019. The **5th and 6th** place finisher will become the alternate at the State Tournament. The alternate will be used in the event of a scratch by a higher placer for their district only.



Team Scoring:

All tournament scoring will be as stated in the National Federation Rule Book (Rule 9, Section 2)

1. TEAM PLACEMENT

First Place - 16 points
Second Place – 12 points
Third Place – 9 points

Fourth Place – 7 points
Fifth Place – 5 points
Sixth Place – 3 points

2. TOURNAMENT SCORING

Individual placement points shall be awarded as soon as earned. Placement points already earned will be deducted in case of a flagrant disqualification from the tournament. Points for team scoring shall be awarded as follows: a. (2) team advancement points shall be scored for each match won in the championship bracket, except for the final first place match. If a wrestler receives a bye in the first round, he shall be awarded 2 advancement points for that round if he wins his next match. No points are awarded for the bye if the wrestler loses his next match.

b. (1) team advancement point shall be scored for each match won in the consolation round, except for the final third and fifth place matches. A wrestler who has a bye in the consolations round shall receive one advancement point, provided he wins the next round match.

Wrestlers from the same school will automatically be award pin points to the winner.

3. POINTS FOR DEFAULT, DISQUALIFICATION, FALL, OR FORFEIT

a. Two additional points will be scored for each match won by default, disqualification, fall, or forfeit throughout the tournament.

b. One and one-half points will be awarded for each match won by a technical fall

c. One point will be awarded for each match won by a major decision.

4. OTHER SCORING

In tournament scoring six places, the winner of each championship quarterfinals shall be awarded three points, and the winner of each championship final shall be awarded for additional place points. The winner of the quarterfinal consolation match shall receive three additional place points. The winner of the third place and the winner of the fifth place shall receive two additional place points.

Student tickets are only for Jr.-Sr. High Students with ASB cards. Children 12 or under & Sr. Citizens (62+) will be admitted at Student Prices. Children under 5 admitted free. Young children must stay with their parents and will not be allowed to run all over the building.



Passes:

- (1) pass for each wrestling participant and alternate.
- (8) passes to cheerleaders as long as they are in uniform and are presented at the Main Ticket Window by their adviser. Cheerleaders will have floor access during actual competition. They are not to stand in front of the ropes and they are not to pound on the floor or mats during actual wrestling.
- (1) Administrator/supervisory pass. (Will be available at the Main Ticket area)
- (1) Cheerleading coach/advisor pass (Available at Main Ticket area)
- Student Manager (1) pass
- (1) School photographer pass and (1) school newspaper reporter pass may be obtained upon presentation of a letter of authorization on school letterhead. School photographers and reporters will not be allowed inside the rope. Passes will be granted in person at the Main Ticket area.
- (2) Coaches passes. If a school has three (3) to (9) nine participants, then (3) coaches passes will be issued. A school with ten (10) or more participants will be issued four (4) coaches passes. (to be issued based on the response form sent in to the Tournament Manager by your Athletic Director.) (If you have more coaches than pass allocations, you will need to purchase tickets for the extra coaches.) **Please e-mail your schools pass list to Mark Swofford no later than Wednesday, 2/6/19. mwofford@northmasonschoools.org**

Pass List Policy:

Pass lists only need to be provided for supervisors, school board members, school administrators, bus drivers and trainers (not school managers) please send such requests to Tournament Director. The list need not include the names of coaches and wrestlers.

Parking:

Parking in the front of school, side of the school and in lot at 71 E. Campus Drive, is first come, first served. Please keep the fire lanes and bus lanes clear at all times.

Bus Parking:

The bus may drop off passengers at the side of the school and then please park in football stadium parking lot. Driver will be directed to the lot by staff.

Lockers & Towels:

Locker room space is limited. Please advise your wrestler not to leave anything in the locker room unattended. Towels will not be furnished.

Locker Room Security:

Locker rooms will be patrolled, but remind your athletes that they are responsible for their own equipment. Locks must be furnished by individual wrestlers.

Crowd Control:

Crowd control at Regional's is a responsibility that must be shared by the administration and coaches of all participating schools. All of us must work closely with Tournament Management to control the conduct of our students and adult fans. Coaches: Please inform your fans, athletes, etc., that they are not allowed to stand between the bleachers and the mats.

Only two (2) personnel will be allowed inside the ropes during a match, chairs are provided with the expectation that they will be used.



Games Committee:

The games committee will consist of three (3) members:

1. The tournament manager or his designee.
2. The Head Official
3. Three (3) coaches designated at the start of the tournament. A coach will not be involved with a decision that involves his/her school.

Concessions:

There will a concession stand open all day Saturday. Private cooking in the building will not be allowed.

A Hospitality Room will be available. This room is reserved for Coaches, Officials and Tournament workers. This does not include coaches' kids, parents, bus drivers, etc.

Floor Restrictions:

No one will be permitted to stand along the mats, including coaches, wrestlers and spectators.

Only media photographers with proper credentials will be allowed inside the ropes. (If they become coaches or cheerleaders, they will lose their floor privileges.)

School photographers are not allowed inside the ropes.

VIDEO CAMERAS OF ANY KIND (INCLUDING CELL PHONES) WILL NOT BE ALLOWED ON THE GYM FLOOR. Filming must take place from the stands.

All photographers must take pictures behind the ropes, but not in front of the bleachers.

Signs:

No signs except official school banners are allowed.

Bands & Noisemakers:

No bands and noisemakers will be allowed.

Practice Facilities:

Mats will be available Friday night for practice from 7:00 pm to 10:00 pm. There will not be any practice mats available during the tournament.

Awards:

Medals will be awarded to the top four (4) wrestlers at each weight class.

We will wrestle the finals on two mats. **Please tell your wrestlers to be in uniform during the awards presentations.** The 106 & 285 pound awards will be presented after the 120 & 220 pound championship match, etc. Immediately after each award presentation, the top four (4) placers will have their picture taken for the Mat Classic program. (Hats & sunglasses will not be allowed).



WITHDRAWAL OF QUALIFIERS

Any school that intends to withdraw a qualified participant should contact Jeanene McCarty, Computer Operator Jeanene.mccarty@gmail.com as soon as possible. This will allow time to contact the alternates.

From Tacoma Narrows Bridge:

On Highway 16 across the Puget Sound towards Bremerton, **continue for approx. 20 miles**, take left onto Highway 3 South toward Shelton, **continue for approx. 10 miles**. Continue on Highway 3 through the town of Belfair and continue South. You will see readerboard on highway, turn left at the sign. Teams should take immediate left and continue approx. 150 yards. Take right and go up slight hill to the school.

Note: Most non-team parking will take the same left at the readerboard on Highway 3, but should turn right onto East Campus Drive and follow up the hill into the center of the campus. When you get to the large parking lot, the school is to the west. Enter on far left of the large building.

WIAA REGIONAL TOURNAMENT WEIGH-IN PROCEDURES

The following National Federation Wrestling Rules weigh-in procedures will be used at all WIAA Regional Tournaments and Mat Classic.

WEIGH-IN WILL PROGRESS MOST SMOOTHLY IF EACH COACH FAMILIARIZES HIS WRESTLERS WITH THE FOLLOWING PROCEDURES PRIOR TO WEIGH-IN.

All weigh-ins will start 2 hours prior to the start of wrestling each day of the tournaments. All wrestlers are to be present and remain in the designated weigh-in area during the weigh-in period. During the weigh-in process no activities that promote dehydration are permitted. Teams can be weigh-d in by weight class or by teams.

The team packet contains a weigh-in card for each entrant and alternate. **The wrestler must present the weigh-in card to gain access to the weigh-in area. THE WRESTLER MUST ALSO PRESENT PHOTO ID SUCH AS AN ASB CARD OR DRIVER'S LICENSE.** In the event the wrestler fails to bring acceptable photo ID then his coach must be present at the weigh-in gate to vouch for the wrestler's identity. The wrestler signs the back of the weigh-in card and then again at the scales.

The wrestler must clear the hair/nails check before being admitted to the weigh-in area. This process should begin approximately 30 minutes prior to the start of weigh-ins.

After clearing the hair/nails check, wrestlers will be admitted to the weigh-in area and wait for the beginning of weigh-ins. There are to be **NO** attempts at dehydration while in the weigh-in area.

After being admitted to the scale area the wrestler must clear **a thorough health check by physicians/Trainers or Officials**, then weigh-in on the scales assigned to his/her weight class.

Weigh-ins shall proceed through the weight classes beginning with the lowest weight class. Wrestlers treated by a Physician prior to the tournament, must bring the Infectious Skin Form, signed by the physician, to weigh-ins. This form is only good for 10 days from date of signature. The tournament Physician/trainer/Official will have final determination on the participation of all wrestlers concerning health and safety issues.

The wrestler must present his/her **weigh-in card and photo ID** to the weigh-in official. If the wrestler makes weight then the official will collect the weigh-in card. **Only wrestlers whose weigh-in card has been collected by the weigh-in official become tournament entrants.**

A wrestler shall weigh-in for only one weight class during the weigh-in period. If only one scale is available, a wrestler may step on and off that scale TWO times to allow for mechanical inconsistencies in the scale. If multiple scales are available, a wrestler may step on and off the first scale TWO times to allow for mechanical inconsistencies in that scale. If the wrestler fails to make weight on the first scale, the wrestler shall immediately step on each of the available scales ONE time in an attempt to make weight.

The weigh-ins end immediately following the completion of the highest weight class or last team.

Female athletes will be weighed-in by an approved Female in a separate area just prior to or immediately following the regular weigh-in process.

ALTERNATE REGISTRATION AND WEIGH-IN PROCEDURES

- A. Every effort will be made to notify coaches in the event their alternate(s) seems likely to become a contestant. However, it is always best to check personally with coaches from within your league.
- B. Alternates may weigh-in at the discretion of their coach. (Follow the procedure listed above.)
- C. Alternates become entrants **only** when a wrestler **from within the alternate's own league/district** is unable to compete due to illness, injury, failure to make weight or expulsion (at league/districts); provided the first tournament bout has not begun.
